ABOUT THE DISABLED LIVING FOUNDATION (DLF)

The DLF is a UK organisation whose primary role is to provide information and advice on assistive technology – equipment designed to enable older or disabled people to live more independently. We maintain a database that lists and describes over 13,000 items of disability equipment together with information on over 2,000 suppliers. The DLF is also a Disabled Living Centre, displaying and demonstrating equipment to give people an opportunity to see for themselves what is available and how it works, enabling them to make an informed choice about the equipment they use.

Our services are not exclusively for disabled and elderly people. We have an educational role amongst professionals working in the field of disability, including students and those working in the area of disability and design. We are not designers ourselves, so cannot advise on the specifics of design, but we can offer designers information on what is available currently, and the advantages and shortcomings of equipment designs.
